Dear Students, Parents and Community Members,

**\$280,000.00 grant** – I sent a message via School Dojo to inform everyone about our grant. We are all very excited to receive this money from Capital Programs and Asset Services. \$125,000 has been allocated to replace the ceilings in the main building and \$155,000 for the structural rectification of the veranda slab at the front of Mrs Zalac's room.

**Good news and not so good news** – Due to the unexpected grant and subsequent work to be done on the veranda of Room 1 we need to delay the start of our Nature Play Outdoor Learning area. Work was due to start this term but cannot commence until the work on the veranda has been completed as machinery and equipment will need access to the area. Although we are all a little disappointed with the delay we are now looking forward to having an even better outdoor space and veranda when it is all completed.

**Future Home Stay opportunities** – As mentioned in our last newsletter we were unable to go ahead with the Chinese Study Tour. The visit has been rescheduled but unfortunately the dates clash with our South Korean program. If you or anyone you know might be interested in hosting a South Korean student (or students) please let me know. If you do not have current accreditation I will be able to help to organise it. The students are due to arrive on Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> July and depart on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> August 2020. This is a total of 18 days including 13 days at school. Families receive approximately \$770.00 per home stay student to assist with the cost of hosting.

**Pastoral Care Worker (PCW) vacancy** - I recently met with a panel comprising of representatives from the Schools Ministry Group (SMG), our local Church and Kersbrook Governing Council to start the process to fill this vacancy. This position will be advertised in our local paper soon and our newsletter. We anticipate the new person commencing work at school at the start of next term.

Thanks to our students, parents and staff for their generous donations. We raised \$220.


