**Principal's tours** – Just a reminder that I will be hosting Principal's tours next Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> May at 9.15am and again in the evening at 6.00pm. If you know of anyone who is looking at enrolling a student for next year please let them know.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) - All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education (2005). From 2018, this data will be used as the basis for national funding. The NCCD involves the collection of:

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students
- student's type of disability if known

Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.

**Life Education Modules** - Life Education will be here on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> June. They deliver a tailored workshop to each class in the school and provide the class teacher with a comprehensive set of resources to continue the learning well beyond their visit. Here are the modules that our students will be doing.

Harold's Friendship for Reception and Year 1 students
After building a model spaceship at school, Harold and his friends, Boots
and Red venture into an imaginary world in outer space. As the adventure
unfolds children explore:

- how to build friendships and care for others
- feelings and emotions
- safe and unsafe situations and early warning signs
- safe places and people to turn to for help

#### All Systems Go for Years 2 - 4

Inside a futuristic machine 'The Venture', the Captain and his crew take the class on a tour of the human body. Travelling through the blood, the class explore and discover how magnificent the human body really is. They learn the functions of various body parts and the actions required to keep these systems working well.

- factors that influence the function of body systems such as exercise and drugs
- exploring ways to manage peer pressure
- the effects of second hand smoke
- the function of vital organs (heart, lungs, brain, kidneys)
- healthy food choices

#### Relate Respect connect for Years 5 - 7

A unique, contemporary module that explores building positive, safe and respectful relationships. Presented via a series of fictitious vlogs that resonate with young people moving through upper primary school and beyond this module focuses on:

- · understanding how to respect ourselves and others
- · identifying characteristics of positive relationships
- · strategies to help maintain positive online and offline relationships
- · strategies to respond to unsafe or disrespectful situations online and offline
- · the importance of relationships to our own and others wellbeing
