Dear Students, Parents and Community Members,

COVID 19 update as at Wednesday 20th May:


Camps - All school camps and excursions (outside of the school grounds) should continue to be deferred for now. SA Health believe it presents an unnecessary risk due to the transport and logistics involved, the need for extra supervisors/parent involvement and sharing of equipment.

Physical distancing - Parents should maintain the 1.5m physical distance between themselves and other adults (parents and teachers) at all times, including school drop off and pick up.

Site Access – Schools should continue to allow essential services staff on site where appropriate social distancing and hygiene measures can be taken. SA Health has advised that volunteering (e.g. parent reading groups) and non-essential services should continue to be postponed.

Rhonda will open the pantry and let you select what you need. We know that many of us are doing it tough at the moment. We never know when we might need help.


Hot Lunches

OSHC FEE INCREASE

Dear Families,

Happy Haven OSHC prides itself on the quality of services, staff and programs that we run for your children. Kloe and her team, really enjoy the time they spend with your children.

There are a number of costs that go towards operating an OSHC service; employee wages, consumables etc. As families would be aware of rising costs of food and other expenses in the home, Happy Haven is also impacted by similar pressures. To enable the continuation of a quality service with resources to support educational and fun activities and a nutritional menu, Happy Haven has reviewed its fee structure.

Whilst Happy Haven established the OSHC in July 2018, the effect of the implementation of the Childcare Subsidy (also occurred in July 2018), which replaced the Childcare Benefit and Rebate was not known. The Childcare Subsidy caused an additional and ongoing administration cost to ensure families receive their entitlements. Unfortunately, it is now necessary to increase OSHC fees to cover the ongoing cost of administering the Childcare Subsidy.

At the beginning of each financial year, the Children's Services Award 2010 is reviewed, and wages increased accordingly. Happy Haven has not passed this cost on to families, but it is now necessary to do so.

In March 2020, the Governing Council approved an increase to OSHC fees. Shortly afterwards, the COV-19 pandemic affected us all. Recognising the uncertainty felt by the community, Happy Haven decided to not pass on the fee increases, which were scheduled to take place from 27 April 2020. To enable families time to adjust to an increase in fees, Happy Haven will not introduce the new fees until 6 Jul 2020.

To assist your understanding of the impact of these increased fees, the table outlines the current and new fees and an indication of the session cost based on a CCS subsidy of 85%:

Additional Fees

There are a range of additional fees that may be charged to families. The current fee structure was developed in 2015, noting of course that Happy Haven has only operated at Kersbrook since July 2018. The new Additional Fee schedule has been approved to recognise the increased costs, which Happy Haven has borne since first introduced.
