Our Mother's Day stall was run by school staff this year and raised a total of \$235.00. All funds will go towards our Year 7 Canberra trip.

heartfelt thanks to all staff, parents and students for their cooperation and support as we have continued to navigate unusual times due to COVID-19. Cooperation and support from everyone has been greatly appreciated.

We are open and almost back to normal - Term 2 started with 77% attendance and has steadily increased. We are expecting almost all of our students to be back at school on Monday. Students have enjoyed catching up with friends and getting back into routine.

Cancellations - A number of events have been cancelled including our school photos, The Royal Adelaide Show in September, our whole school camp scheduled for Term 3, a visit from the Crows and Pupil Free Day scheduled for 8th May. At this stage we are not sure if our proposed Year 7 trip to Canberra in Term 4 will go ahead or not. This is a very expensive trip and costs about \$950.00 per student. The school usually undertakes fundraising activities to help support families with the cost. One of our usual fundraisers is Hot Dog days. Due to stricter hygiene concerns we are instead offering hot packaged meals.

Order hot food for lunch - We know how much students (and their parents) enjoy the opportunity to order hot food for lunch so we have been able to source some pre packed hot food that we can heat up on the day and deliver to classes. All students were given an order form today. The choices are *Beef Lasagne * Honey Soy chicken with rice and vegetables * Macaroni Cheese . We made Anzac poppies in Room 2. Our challenge was to make 3 different poppies using materials in our classroom. We then strung them up in the office for all to appreciate.





Room1 read <u>Anzac</u> <u>Ted</u> and ate Anzac biscuits.



Room 3 began Anzac celebrations by following a procedure video to make poppies. Miss Johnson made a purple poppy and discussed that the purpose for the purple poppy is a symbol of remembrance for animals that served during wartime.







Nate: I enjoyed making Anzac cookies. Eliza: We used our Fractions to double the recipe. Elli: I enjoyed using our Math and baking skills to make Anzac biscuits.

Blaze: DMG, so yum! We ate the raw dough that was leftover and were able to have two cookies each. Students also had the opportunity in pairs to research a recipe for Anzac cookies.


